## Alert

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## About

SEELEWASCHEN is a generative sound environment which was originally composed by Karlheinz Essl for an outdoor light installation by the German artist Rainer Gottemeier. Using the sound of one single bell stroke as its basic material, the piece unfolds a rich sonic cosmos by a computer program. Taking advantage compositional algorithms that have been developed by Karlheinz Essl since the early 1980ies, the piece is generated in realtime. It can be perceived as a sonic organism which might serve as a source for inspiration and meditation, running forever and ever...

This piece neither requires nor offers any user interaction. It runs entirely on its own, driven by its internal random-controlled algorithms which ensure variability and richness, even over a long time. The author does not feel obliged to make any changes to the program, but he is eager to hear your comments.

The piece was premiered on 17 Apr 2004 during the Donaufestival at the Alte Werft in Korneuburg, Austria and was running there as an outdoor installation for 3 weeks. The piece was re-designed to be presented at the

RESONANCES 2004 festival at Ircam (Paris) where it appears as a 4-channel sound installation.

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## System requirements

- Apple Macintosh Computer
- macOS 10.14 or later

## Quick intro

- Launch the application by double-clicking on [SEELEWASCHEN\\_4.0.app](#)
- You might get an alert message by macOS telling that this app is from an unknown developer, control-click or right click the icon of the SEELEWASCHEN\_4.0 app. Then select "Open" from the top of contextual menu that appears. Now the program will start.
- When SEELEWASCHEN has opened, select an „Output Device” in the „Audio Status” window and switch „Audio” on.
- Click into the black start/stop square on the upper-right corner in the main window. The sound generation process will start automatically in a few seconds.
- Listen and enjoy - and watch the pictures!

## Menus

- About SEELEWASCHEN...: general information about the program and its author.
- Settings: here you can change the "Audio" settings for internal or external audio hardware and start/stop the generatio process
- Info: supplies links to updates and other software by Karlheinz Essl.

## Compositional aspects

The sound material for this piece was drawn from a single stroke of a church bell. By the aid of realtime composition algorithms, three different structural types (DRONES, STROKES, TEXTURES) are generated by 7 independent sound layers:

- DRONES: sustained sounds with slow fade-in and fade-out (exploring the technique of „granular synthesis“) which appear in 7 different transpositions. Those transpositions are based on harmonic scales (quarternote scales, thirddtone scales, or all-interval-rows); the manifold combinations of its intervals are creating the basic harmonic structure in which the entire piece is embedded.
- STROKES: isolated bell strokes with long sustain, in 7 different transpositions (see above).
- TEXTURES: rapidly changing transposition of the church sound using very high overtones relationships which result in a rich texture that resembles the sound of birds.
